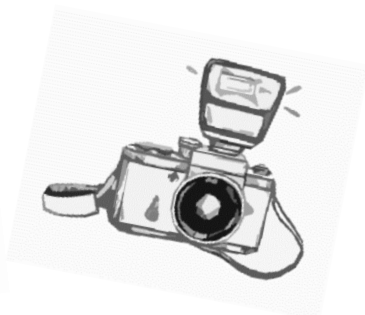

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ARTS AND CRAFT REGULATIONS

The Society reserves the right to disqualify any exhibitor who does not comply with regulations. The Regulations are not negotiable.

1. Entry fee \$1 (unless otherwise stated). Entry fees include GST and are non-refundable.
 2. Entries (i.e. entry forms & entry money) must be received at the office of the Show Society (or by direct deposit see entry form) by Friday 15th October 2021. **NO POSTED ITEMS WILL BE ACCEPTED. No late entries will be accepted.**
 3. Normal Office Hours 9am to 2pm Tuesday, Wednesday & Thursday. Volunteers will be in the office Monday 11th October to Friday 15th October from 9am to 12.00pm, and Thursday 14th 9am to 2pm to take entries.
 4. All entries must have been completed in the last 18 months and not previously entered in an Albury Show.
 5. A novice exhibitor is one who has not won a first prize at an Albury Annual Show.
 6. Laundered articles or worn articles are **not** eligible for entry.
 7. Machine made articles must not have any handwork, unless otherwise stated.
 8. The society reserves the right to refuse any entry without assigning any reason thereto.
 9. All exhibits must have tickets firmly attached: e.g. safety pins, sewn, tape, dressmaker pins not allowed.
 10. All exhibits must be the bona-fide property, and homemade work, of the exhibitor.
 11. Each exhibit is eligible to be entered in one class only.
 12. Stewards reserve the right to put wrongly entered exhibits into the correct classes.
 13. The Co-coordinator reserves the right to cancel, change, create, or combine classes; according to the number of entries received.
 14. **Judging in the J. J. Wright Pavilion will commence on Thursday 28th October 2021** at 10 am promptly. No spectators will be permitted in the judging area. No exhibitor or associate will initiate conversation with a judge on judging day, before, during or after judging.

ARTS AND CRAFT REGULATIONS continued:

15. The judge may withhold a prize, or only award a second, if the exhibit is not up to standard. The judge's decision is final.
16. Whilst all due care will be taken by the Society's committee, stewards and representatives, no responsibility will be incurred by the Society.
17. Points awarded in each section: 1st - 5 points, 2nd - 3 points.
18. **Prize money will be available for collection Sunday 31st October 2021 in the J.J. Wright Pavilion** on presentation of prize vouchers. Prize money not collected by Friday 6th November 2021 will be refunded to the Show Society. Note - all perpetual trophies will remain in the Albury Show Society Office, on the Albury Show ground.
19. Entry forms to be by email, mail or in person
20. The Show Society will be the sole arbiter on any question of the eligibility of an entry.
21. Any exhibitor or associate who behaves offensively on the Showground will be removed from the ground and may be refused future admission.
22. Any protest or question about a competition result must be directed to the Co-coordinator of the section within 24 hours of judging. If the exhibitor is not satisfied with the answer or decision, he or she may lodge a formal protest with the Show Secretary within 12 hours of the chief steward's response.
This formal protest will be dealt with by the Show Society's Executive Committee which will give a final decision within 24 hours.
Details of the protest must be accompanied by a deposit of \$50 which will be forfeited if the protest is deemed frivolous.

DELIVERY OF EXHIBITS

Please adhere strictly to delivery times as stated in this schedule.
Exhibits lodged after the delivery time, will not be staged or judged.

1. **All exhibits must have entry tickets attached before delivery to the nominated pavilion building or office.**
2. The J. J. Wright Pavilion is located on the East of Hague Avenue (off Fallon Street).
3. The committee will give every possible facility to exhibitors and every care will be taken of exhibits, but no responsibility will be incurred by the Society.
4. Exhibits shall not be removed **before 3pm on Sunday 31st October 2021**; except as the Co-coordinator may direct.
5. Competitors taking part in any show competition do so at their own risk.
6. The Committee reserves the right to refuse entry without assigning any reason.

6. A list of items to be judged must be placed with the entry.

WOOLLEN ARTICLES/GARMENTS

STATE COMPETITION.

THREE (3) WOOL ARTICLES/GARMENTS OF DISTINCT TYPE

Articles/Garments may be knitted, crocheted, sewn, felted etc. and must be handcrafted. Use of sewing machine is not permitted. (Minimum wool content 80%). The Pavilion Co-Coordinator in consultation with the appropriate Pavilion Section Judges may select three (3) suitable individual exhibits, and, with the exhibitor's permission, enter them in the Group Judging as an exhibit representing the particular Society concerned. It is the responsibility of the Group Secretary and Winner to co-ordinate the transfer of the winning entry to the ASC office in Sydney for the State Judging.

CONDITIONS:

1. For the purpose of this competition the following definitions apply:
 - A) Garment: an item that can be worn e.g. Dress, jacket, scarf, hat.
 - B) Article: a utility item that is not worn but can be used in the home e.g. blanket: without an outfit, e.g. bag: for amusement, e.g. toy: as a decoration. picture etc.
2. An exhibitor in this competition may be one individual or a group of individuals or an organisation.
3. All three articles/garments must have been made within twelve months of the Local Show and made by the exhibitor/s.
4. An exhibit having won at a Local Show may be exhibited (the same three articles/garments) at the Group Final. The winner of the Group Final may then be exhibited (the same three articles/garments) at the RAS State Final (Sydney Show).
5. An exhibit (the same three articles/garments) having won at the Local Show level is not eligible to enter this class at any other show until after Group Judging, when, if not being the winning entry, may then compete further.
6. An exhibit is only eligible to represent one Society at Group level and one Group at State Level.
7. An exhibitor having won at Group level CANNOT compete further until after the Royal Show.
8. A sample of the yarn, fabric or fibre with label must be attached to each item making up the exhibit. If a label is not available as a hand spun/felted, a handwritten label with relevant details and sample will suffice.
9. An exhibit (article/garment) previously competed at Group level is not eligible to compete again.

Please ensure that all entries are entered correctly into their proper sections and class (refer to rules and regulations).

“Gummed entry stickers must be stuck firmly to each bottle/jar.

Bottles and Jars -

375gram jars preferred for jams, jellies and chutneys. All jar lids to be clean and free of any manufacturer’s labels, but clearly indicating contents. Lids with lid covers accepted as lid being ‘label free’. No paraffin wax to be left on bottles or jars.

To comply with health regulations, cellophane covers will not be accepted. Please remove all cellophane covers and replace with lids prior to delivering exhibits to showground.

Jam- Contains the bulk of the fruit.

Marmalade- Rind must be clear, bright & light.

*** Must be at least 2 entries in each class before a prize will be rewarded.

DECORATED CAKES

Section DC

INSTRUCTIONS - General

1. Decorated Cake exhibits will be received in the J. J. Wright Pavilion on Thursday 28th October 2021 between 8am & 9am.
2. Exhibits to be collected from the Stewards on duty on Sunday 31st October 2021 between 3pm and 4pm
3. Entries close Friday 15th October 2021.
4. No late entries will be accepted.
5. You may use: Ribbon, tulle, wire, braid, stamens, manufactured pillars, food colouring, posies, picks, cotton thread and cotton net.
6. You may **not** use: Manufactured lace and feathers. No manufactured props. All exhibits must be able to be lifted by one person. Wire not to penetrate the covered cake. No artificial paper fabric leaves or flowers to be used. No pins allowed
7. Cakes and blocks must be on baseboards and have cleats.
8. Baseboards for plaques to be no bigger than 20cm.
9. Plaques must be on cleats or on a stand. This rule will be enforced.
10. Any exhibits which do not meet the specifications will be disqualified and marked 'not according to the schedule'
11. Dummy cakes are allowed - cleats must be attached to all boards and baseboards including plaques.
12. The base presentation board must fit within the perimeter of 38cm square.



DECORATED CAKES- OPEN

Section DCO

1. DECORATED WEDDING CAKE - One, two or three tiers covered with rolled fondant.
2. DECORATED SPECIAL OCCASION CAKE - Birthday, Christening - single tier, must include inscription.
3. DECORATED CHRISTMAS CAKE - rolled fondant.
4. DECORATED NOVELTY CAKE - rolled fondant
5. ARRANGEMENT OF HANDMADE SUGAR FLOWERS - Suitably presented e.g. Vase or Stand. Sugar craft only - **NOT** manufactured. Must be adhered to baseboard. Baseboard to be no larger than 23cm at widest point.
6. ICING PLAQUE OF OWN CHOICE - Presented on baseboard. Baseboard to be no larger than 20cm at widest point.
7. CREATIVE STYLE - Sugar Craft only - Must be original design. Maybe complimented with other handwork. Suitable presentation base, plaque or otherwise.
8. DECORATION SUITABLE FOR TOP OF CAKE- Presented on a plaque & baseboard. Baseboard to be no larger than 20cm at widest point.
9. SPECIAL CLASS **OPEN TO ALL** - Four Patty Cakes no more than 7.5cm at widest point. Suitable for birthday.

*Please refer to conditions set out under Instructions General - no exceptions open to those exhibitors who have not won as first prizes in a similar class at **any** show previously.*

Please refer to conditions set out under decorated cakes - no exceptions open to those exhibitors who have not won a first prize in a similar class at **any** show previously.

2. Exhibits to be collected from the Stewards on Duty at the J. J. Wright Pavilion on Sunday 31st October 2021 between 3pm and 4pm.
3. Entries close Friday 15th October 2021.
4. No late entries will be accepted
5. All entries must be homemade and home baked. No commercial packet mixture.
6. Must be presented in oven bags (i.e. not in glad wrap, plastic or freezer bags).
7. All entries to be placed on foil covered hard base (i.e. not plates) to suit baking.
8. **Junior Cooking** is for entrants 13years and under and in disposable plastic plates of appropriate size and presented in **oven** bags.
9. **Novice Cooking** is for entrants who have not entered in the Cooking section in previous years.

INGREDIENTS:

| 250gr (8oz) Sultanas | 250gr (8oz) Soft Brown Sugar |
| 1/2 teas. Grated Nutmeg | 1/3 cup Sherry or Brandy |
| 250gr (8oz) Currants | 4 large eggs |
| 1/2 teas. Ground Cloves | 250gr (8 oz) Plain Flour |
| 125gr (4 oz) Chopped Mixed Peel | 1/2 teas. Vanilla Essence |
| 1/2 teas. Ground Ginger | 60gr (2 oz) Self Raising Flour |
| 90gr (3oz) Chopped Red Glazed Cherries | 250gr (8oz) chopped Raisins |
| 250gr (8oz) Butter | 1/2 teas. Almond Essence |
| 90gr (3oz) Chopped Blanched Almonds | Lemon Rind or 1/2 teas. Lemon Essence |

METHOD:

Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with the Sherry or Brandy. Cover mixture and leave for at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight. Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together butter and sugar with essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternately add the fruit and flour mixtures. Mix thoroughly. The mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon. Place the mixture into a prepared **square** tin no larger than 20cm (8") and bake in a slow oven for approximately 3 ½ to 4 hours. Allow the cake to cool in the tin.

NOTE: To ensure uniformity and depending on the size, it is suggested that the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces and cherries into 4-6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces.
